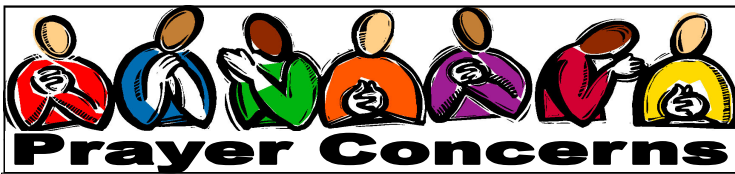

The addictions which are more destructive are drug and alcohol abuse. Addictions are things which throw our lives off balance, steering us in directions that are counter-productive and away from The Father.

Dealing with a family member who is struggling with the battle of addiction (drugs and alcohol) affects the entire family. Addiction can wreak havoc in already fragile marriages and family dynamics. It is possible however, to grow in these circumstances. What is needed is very careful and intense communication and love for the entire family without enabling the addict. While we long to "help" the addict, we do not want to enable them to continue their addiction. This is a very difficult and long process. Groups like Al-Anon work very hard to help families consumed with addiction get healthy. There are meetings scattered across Shreveport-Bossier. We are beginning a group here at Kings Highway Christian Church meant as a support group for those of us with family members who have substance issues. 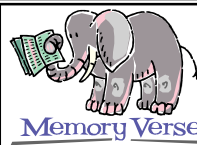
