A few months ago my oldest brother sent my family a simple telescope kit. After taking all the pieces out of the box we put it together and I was relieved that it actually looked like the picture on the package. We took the telescope outside to try it out. The instructions had said that we should be able to see at least six of Jupiter's moons. A bit skeptically I trained the telescope in on that distant spot, looked through the eyepiece, and immediately saw Jupiter looking like a large white dot. Then as my eyes adjusted I was able to see what looked like tiny points of light on each side of the planet. They were lined up so perfectly that these faint lights could only have been moons in orbit. It was a beautiful sight and it was thrilling to see so clearly something that is so distant.

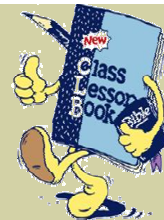

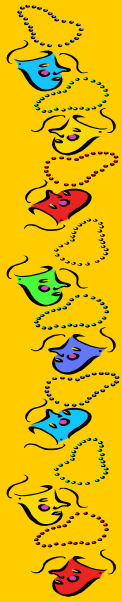

Elvia and her son Juan David (7 years old), are one of the two families who had the blessing of being at Casa Esperanza for Christmas and New Year. Juan David came for a long treatment that is going to last at least until March. They arrived in Shreveport on November 19th 2009. They first stayed at the Hospital, and then when his father Ramon and his older brother Ramoncito came from Panama to spend the holidays together, they stayed at Casa Esperanza. "We have never been apart for Christmas, to have the opportunity of being together was a blessing for us," Elvia said. The father and older brother went back to their home-country where they are awaiting a more independent Juan David.

This is Juan David's first time at Shriners and it was also his first surgery. He had major surgery of the hips, legs, and feet to correct his posture and the way he walks. He was able to get around with a walker before the surgery. After surgery he will still need a walker, but he will have stronger legs that will allow him to be a more independent child, able to walk and play easily. His recovery has been slower than the doctors were expecting, but it has been progressive, too.

They may be coming back to Casa Esperanza for some other weekend to rest and be away from the Hospital before they leave.

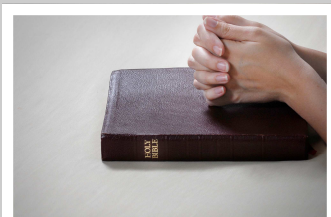

U.P.P.E.R

When thinking of February I automatically think of LOVE. This month's U.P.P.E.R.s will be relating to God's LOVE for us. I would like to share a devotional my brother, Donnie, wrote about experiencing God's LOVE.

February 14

Dear friends, let us love one another, for love comes from God. Everyone who loves has been born of God and knows God.

No one has ever seen God; but if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is made complete in us. - 1 John 4:7, 12

Through the morphine induced fog, I tried to clear my mind and concentrate on my sister's face as she gently squeezed my hand. It wasn't easy because I kept wanting to slip back into that comfortable state of nothingness that I had been in since my surgery. Finally, I managed to clear my mind and I got my thick tongue working well enough to rasp out the words, "What did the doctor say?"

I could tell by the anguished look on my sister's face and the tears welling in her eyes that the news wasn't good. "Donnie," she finally breathed, "he says you have pancreatic cancer." She added a little too quickly, "We're gonna fight this and we're gonna deal with it."

A couple of hours later, Doctor Zibari came in and explained in vivid terms that I'll never forget the predicament that I was in. He had removed three tumors from on and around my pancreas: one was in my gall bladder; another had surrounded and squeezed shut my bile duct; a final one was on the pancreas itself. He had held and examined all three in his hands and was convinced that all three were malignant. With great sadness in his voice, he said, "I wish I could give you better news."

Obviously, the fact that I'm here and writing this devotional means that I didn't die of pancreatic cancer. Three days after delivering the news that I had pancreatic cancer, Doctor Zabari came back in my room with biopsy reports and an amazed look on his face. "Mr. Barmore, these reports show no cancer!" He explained the reports to me, and added, "I really don't understand this, because if ever I have seen cancer, this was cancer."

While some may wonder how such a good doctor could misdiagnose my disease, I choose to see it in a different way. I believe that the prayers that were offered up on my behalf by so many people brought about a miracle—that I was healed of pancreatic cancer. I believe that I was healed, but what I know is that during that difficult time, I experienced the love of God through the people of God in a way that I had never experienced it before. My dear sister was my nurse for two months as I recuperated at her home. My pastors were towers of strength and encouragement. A prayer blanket from Trinity covered my physically, but more importantly, it covered me with prayers. Trinity and Temple Baptist in Ruston, First Baptist in Dubach, and King's Highway Christian Church in Shreveport had dozens and dozens of people regularly praying for me. My students and colleagues at Cedar Creek had prayer vigils for me, regularly sent cards and pictures, and many even visited. I will forever appreciate and treasure the hundreds of cards, calls, and visits from friends, relatives, and acquaintances.

This experience reinforced in my life something that I already knew but was beginning to take for granted. *God is love. Love comes from God; therefore, we should love one another. If we love one another, God lives in us and His love is made complete in us.*
