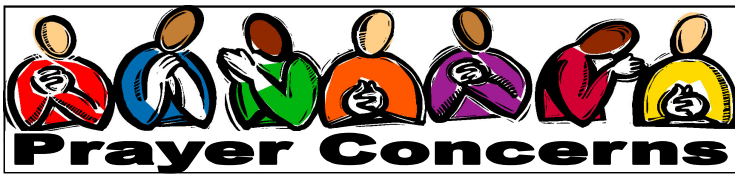
CYF MidWinter Retreat
