From the Minister. . . .

How do you respond when you receive a gift? Most of us respond by thanking the giver both in person and perhaps with a thank you note. If we don't care for the gift we might slip it away quietly into some back closet until it eventually finds its way to Good Will. If the gift is something we like then we will display it, use it, or consume it, depending on what kind of gift it is. Gifts that we receive are important reminders of friendship and love but they are rarely life changing.

However, there are times in our lives when we receive gifts that are so meaningful they change us in an unexpected and dramatic fashion. These life-changing gifts rarely take the form of material possessions but are usually gifts of encouragement or practical help that cause us to see the world in a new way. In these cases our gratitude can't be expressed in a simple note but instead is expressed in the way we live our lives everyday.

In Paul's letter to the Philippians Paul exhorts the members of the church in Philippi to, "continue to work out your salvation with fear and trembling" (Philippians 2:12). These words describe the way we are called to show our gratitude for the gracious gift of God in Christ that has healed our relationship with God. First we are called to work by showing God's love to others everyday. As Fred Craddock writes in his commentary on Philippians, "The church is to actualize in concrete ways, in energy burning, time-consuming endeavors, the mind of Christ."

So we work with fear and trembling—or a sense of awe—because actualizing the mind of Christ is a daunting task. We also work with fear and trembling because we have received a gift that is so great we can never repay it no matter how we may try. But with our fear and trembling we also respond to the gracious gift of God in Christ by working with joy in our hearts because we have received a gift that shows us, more clearly than any other gift could, God's great love for us. So let us not only feel God's love in the weeks ahead, let us show God's love to others as we work together as a church to continue Christ's ministry on this earth.

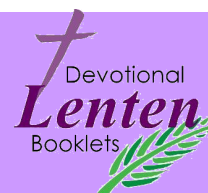

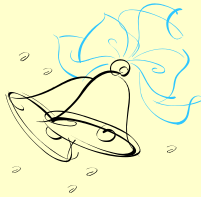

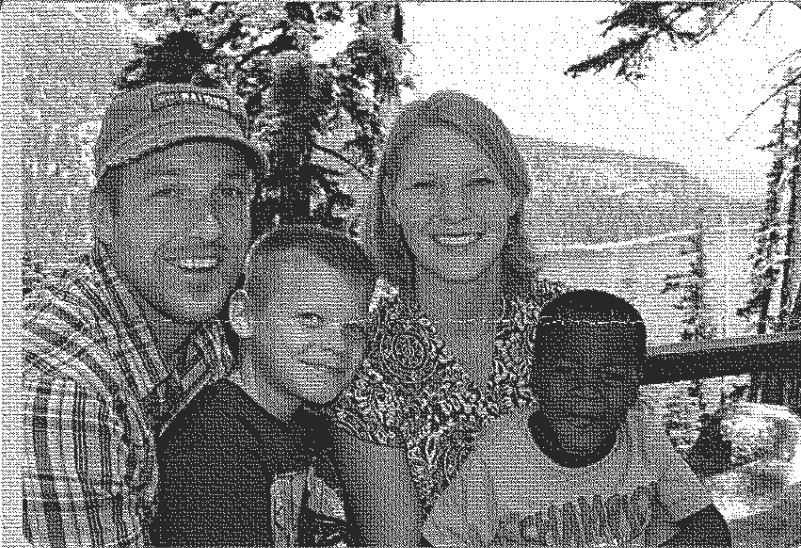

Dear Friends,

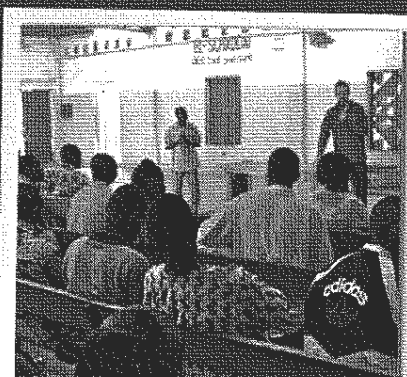

Highlights from each season of 2010:

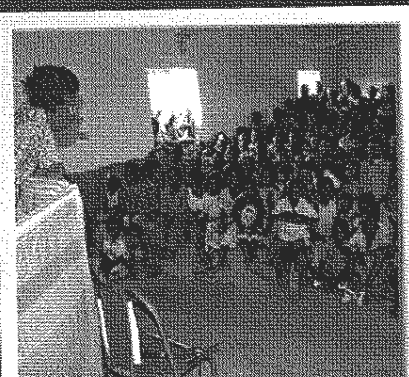
SPRING: Operation Christmas Child 2010: 20,000 kids in 70 outreaches were told and shown the Gospel. We had trained 21 volunteers in puppets, drama and evangelism to do these outreaches. Thousands of children understood who Jesus really is for the 1st time and many accepted Him as Lord. Also we discovered that there are many here in Burkina who are also called to Children's ministry. We laid hands on them and anointed them to do children's ministry for the first time. During the celebration party at our house to thank the volunteers for a job well done, **they told us, "No we're not done yet! We want to keep going."** So they continued and did dozens of outreaches on their own well into the summer while we were in the States.

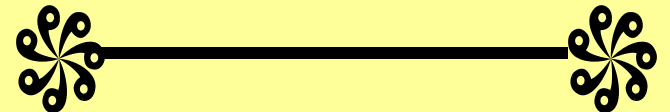

A “Note” from the KHCC Music Department:

Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah



The great awakening of the 1700’s was a heaven-sent revival to many parts of the world. In America, the preaching of George Whitefield and Jonathan Edwards renewed Christian zeal and swept multitudes into the kingdom. In England, the open air evangelism of Whitefield and the Wesley brothers did the same. In Wales it was the electrifying preaching of Howell Harris and his convert William Williams.

Williams, son of a wealthy farmer, graduated from the university as a physician, intending to become a medical doctor. But hearing a sermon that Harris preached while standing on a gravestone in Talgarth churchyard, he was converted. Soon thereafter, he changed professions to become a physician of the soul—a preacher.

During his 43 years of itinerant ministry, Williams traveled over 95,000 miles, drawing crowds of 10,000 or more. Once he spoke to an estimated 80,000, noting in his journal, “God strengthened me to speak so loud that most could hear.”

Williams is best remembered, however, for his hymns. He has been called the “Sweet Singer of Wales,” and the “Watts of Wales.” In all, he composed over eight hundred hymns, his best known being this autobiographical prayer with its many Old Testament allusions, which first appeared in Williams collection of Welsh hymns, “Alleluia” (1745), entitled “Strength to Pass Through the Wilderness.”

Williams lived as a pilgrim, pressing through the snow of winter, the rains of springtime, and the heat of summer. He was beaten by mobs (once nearly dying) and cheered by crowds, but in all his travels he sought only to do the will of God until his death at age 74.

Many years later, when President James Garfield was dying of an assassin’s bullet, he seemed to temporarily rally and was allowed to sit by the window. His wife began singing this hymn, and the president, listening intently, began to cry. To his doctor, Willard Bliss, he said, “Glorious, Bliss, isn’t it?”

Guide Me, O Thou Great Jehovah was also sung at the funeral of England’s Princess Diana.
