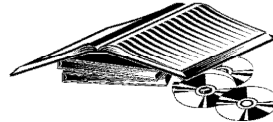

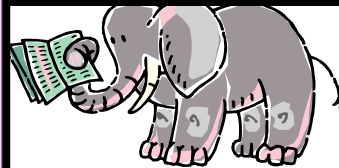

CALLING FOR ACOLYTES



If you are interested in being a candle lighter on Sunday morning, please meet with Ms. Barbara on Sunday, October 7, at 8:50 A.M. at the chancel steps in the sanctuary. Please be aware of the following information:

ACOLYTE GUIDELINES & PROCEDURES

AGE REQUIREMENTS – Priority is given in the following order

- A. 4th-5th Grade
- B. 3rd Grade

HEIGHT – Regardless of age, if a person is not tall enough to light the candle, they will be unable to be an Acolyte.

DRESS – Shorts & flip-flops are NOT appropriate! We are not using robes at either service. Dress nicely or someone else will be asked to serve in your place.

RESPONSIBILITY – To “bring the Light of Christ” into the service; and, to “take the Light of Christ out into the whole world” at the end of the service. **THERE ARE NO OTHER TASKS ASSOCIATED WITH BEING AN ACOLYTE.**

PROCESS – Diaconate will light the torchier in the Narthex/Front entry. Proceed on the Prelude. Walk with the music at a normal pace. Be careful that you do not walk too fast. Turn the torchier and gently light the candle. **DO NOT BLOW THE TORCHIER OUT AT THE TABLE.** Walk away from the table (down the chancel steps to the side behind the brick pillar), then, holding one hand behind the light, blow the light out gently.

COMMITMENT – This is an important part of the service. If you cannot be present, please contact the **ALTERNATE** on your list, or one of the other Acolytes. **WE SHOULD BE PREPARED EVERY SUNDAY!**

September is the time of year for Joel and Heidi Hayslip's mission team in Burkina to begin preparing for Christmas. **GIVE A KID A CHRISTMAS** is the wonderful ministry they have done for the past 4 years. It brings the Gospel message in a vibrant and tangible way to thousands of children. Their team goes into elementary schools and into remote villages to bring a drama troupe presenting a full-gospel drama written for children. Afterward, each child is given a backpack with toys and school supplies as a tangible demonstration and reminder of God's love. Last year they raised \$20,000 and were able to minister to 2000 children. This year their prayer is to reach 3000 children.

The Disciples Women Ministries of Kings Highway have generously donated to this ministry for the past 2 years. This year the Hayslip's sent unique African ornaments to be used to decorate a Christmas tree. Those donating \$25 to \$25 or more may choose an ornament to put on their tree to remind them to pray for these precious children.
