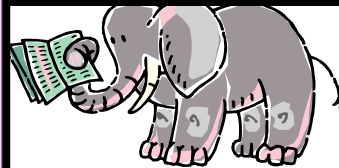

From the church nurse

I am writing this from the 2007 American Heart Association Scientific Sessions in Orlando, Florida. Today, the first day of the session has been very informative.

Much of the information has to do with the effects of obesity and associated “metabolic syndrome” in which the body becomes more and more resistant to its own insulin leading to Type II Diabetes.

One presenter spoke about the visual effects of food. He said we are conditioned to eat more when food in big bowls is presented rather than when the same amount of food is presented in lesser filled, more numerous bowls. Also the new literature on “Super tasters” vs “Non-tasters” and the way these two groups make their food choices has much to do with it. Super tasters are those who historically can taste the bitterness of saccharin, while Non-tasters, not so much. Non-tasters seem to have higher incidents of heart disease because they tend to eat foods higher in fat and sodium.

Another snippet was that lean people who did not exercise had worse outcomes than their heavier counterparts who consistently worked out, even though they maintained too much weight. These are surprising findings and seem to indicate that we need to “keep moving” if possible.

The last presenter of the day was a physician who was knighted by England’s Queen Elizabeth. He spoke of the large disparity in the world’s healthcare systems. Variables such as gender, ethnicity, socioeconomic status, education level and location had great effect on patient’s outcomes. He called for a greater effort to be more inclusive for the world’s less fortunate population and urged us to be vigilant in fighting discrimination in healthcare delivery.

It has been a wonderful conference, and it is only the first day! If you have any questions about what information we gleaned, let me know.
