MISSION TRIP TO EL SALVADOR IS BACK

Last year KHCC had the opportunity to bring Good News overseas to one of the poorest countries in Latin America - El Salvador. We were supporting Shalom Children's Home, which houses about 70 children between 1-17 years old. Jesus Bulnes, one of our Hispanic Ministers, went to El Salvador with some other Christians from a local church. Then, KHCC was able to bring them love, hope and care. Also they worked building some more rooms and repairing some others to improve their home. In addition we gave them a generous donation to provide clothing, medicines, food, toys, and other needs of the children.

When Jesus came back, he shared a simple but wonderful story he experienced there. "One day, after a very long day of hard work, I was taking a little rest when a boy came to me and said: 'Jesus, thank you for painting my room. I like it so much..' I was not in the group of people who painted his room, and for a moment I had the intention to clear that point, but then I understood that we were working as a team...just like Jesus does things through us when we respond to the needs of others. In the same way, you were part of that mission.

One year has passed since then. Time is running so fast.... and it is time to prepare for the 2007 Mission Trip to El Salvador (July 5th - 14th). Two KHCC members are going this year - Marguerite Harper and Jose Mendoza. Through them our church is going to bring the Good News to all those children and again they will come back with a "big thanks" from all of them.

"This was my first chance to go on a mission like this, but it really touched my life, because you can feel the power and love of Jesus Christ working through your hands."
