Summer time is the season for fun but also insect bites and other minor injuries. Watching these injuries are important because occasionally aggressive infections occur. Warning signs include rapid and extreme swelling, unusual pain, red discoloration of the affected area that grows rapidly sometimes with chills and fever. If there is a question about an insect bite or injury it is always better to be safe than sorry and seek medical attention immediately. There are cases of MRSA, which is a resistant strain of Staph. Strep. has also become resistant and frequently previously used antibiotics will not work. There are newer antibiotics that your physician will prescribe that are more effective. MISSION TRIP TO EL SALVADOR

Our Hispanic Ministry has the opportunity to participate in a mission trip to one of the poorest countries in Latin America, El Salvador.

The mission is going to support Shalom Children's Home. This home houses about 70 children between 1—17 years old. Shalom Home's goal is to raise needy children in their county and culture with a Christian emphasis providing education. These children can later go back into their society as professionals and make a Christian impact helping other needy children.

We expect that KHCC through the Hispanic Ministry may bring blessings and support to this home. Jesus' Bolnas, one of our ministers is going on the Mission trip leaving on May 27th and returning June 3rd. If you would like to participate by donating items here is a list of what is needed: twin size bed sheets, bath towels/hand towels, hair styling gel, shampoo, hair nets for the kitchen, nude panty hose, cough syrup with expectorant, cold & flu meds, pepto bismol/imodium (generics are fine) baby wipes, diapers, diaper rash cream, vasoline, Gerber baby food, backpacks for school.

Cash donations are also needed. Part of the cost of the trip is covered but we still need money for construction projects and to help cover some expenses for Jesus.

"YOUTH SPONSORS - Perhaps the most important role that laypersons can play in the lives of our youth ministry is that of a youth sponsor. While rewarding, this is also an extremely demanding job that is not to be taken lightly. It requires an immense sacrifice of time, patience, and talent, but there are few who have done it that regret the sacrifice they made." – Youth Advisory Handbook

In compliance with guidelines set out by the Youth Advisory Committee, Tammy Bradford (Christian Education Committee) and Becky Flippo (Youth Advisory Committee) will be accepting recommendations for Chi Rho and CYF sponsors for the 2006-2007 school year. Sponsors must be at least 25 years of age; and, while cases may be considered on an individual basis, as a rule, a person should be a regularly attending member of KHCC in both a worship service and Sunday school class for at least 6 months before they will be considered for a position as a youth sponsor.

Youth Ministry Team members should be committed:

- To grow and mature in their relationship with God.
- To provide a good example of a faithful Christian by regular attendance in worship.
- To support, uphold, and know the purpose statement of the Youth Ministry Team.
- To agree to attend meetings with other Youth Ministry Team members to study, evaluate, plan for coming events, and to relax and have fun.
- To be prepared to attend rallies, summer camp, lock-ins, and/or trips.
- To serve for the school year and summer.
- To agree to openly express an eagerness and willingness to do new things with an upbeat and positive attitude.
- To work to establish relationships with the youth as we encourage them to explore, discover, and deepen their own faith.
