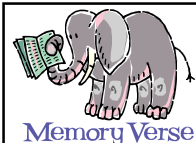

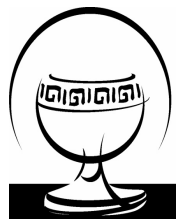

**MISSION TRIP TO EL SALVADOR**

Our Hispanic Ministry has the opportunity to participate in a mission trip to one of the poorest countries in Latin America, El Salvador.

The mission is going to support Shalom Children's Home. This home houses about 70 children between 1—17 years old. Shalom Home's goal is to raise needy children in their county and culture with a Christian emphasis providing education. These children can later go back into their society as professionals and make a Christian impact helping other needy children. We expect that KHCC through the Hispanic Ministry may bring blessings and support to this home.

Jesus Bolnas, one of our ministers is going on the Mission trip leaving on May 27th and returning June 3rd. If you would like to participate by donating items here is a list of what is needed: twin size bed sheets, bath towels/hand towels, hair styling gel, shampoo, hair nets for the kitchen, nude panty hose, cough syrup with expectorant, cold & flu meds, pepto bismol/imodium (generics are fine) baby wipes, diapers, diaper rash cream, vasoline, Gerber baby food, backpacks for school.
