From Your Minister

Dear Friends,

Last Sunday we announced a proposed change in our schedule for Sunday mornings. This proposal was developed by our staff, church cabinet and elders and has three main elements. First, that we combine our Casual (8:30) and Traditional (10:50) services into one worship service where you can dress casually if you choose but still experience the best parts of our traditional service (like the choir and organ for example). Second, that we put this new combined Traditional/Casual service at 9:15 on Sunday morning, Sunday School at 10:15, and Contemporary Worship at 11:11. And third, that we try out this schedule for four months (through the end of 2006) and see how it works.

I am excited about this proposal because I believe that it will help us to better fulfill the great commission that Christ gave us to go and make disciples. I believe that by merging these two services we will have a fuller sanctuary on Sunday and a more positive worship experience, which in turn will lead more people to our doorstep and to a lasting relationship with Jesus Christ.

I also believe that changing the times of the services will result in a better worship experience in both the Contemporary and the Traditional Services because our ministers and our members will have the opportunity to participate fully in both services.

While no schedule will be perfect for everyone, I believe that in general the new schedule of Traditional Worship first, Sunday School second, and Contemporary Worship third fits well with the needs of the different types of visitors we are hoping to draw to each of these services. There are thousands of churches like ours around the country, many in our community, that have already made this kind of change and they have benefited from it.

That's enough of what I believe, now I need to hear what you believe. These next few weeks will be our opportunity to voice either our support for or our concerns over this proposed change in our schedule. The decision whether or not to try this schedule for four months will be made based on the feedback we receive. So please let us know your thoughts, opinions, or concerns.

KNIT Café News

KNIT Café is gearing up again after a couple of weeks off. Meeting time is 6:00 pm the 2nd and 4th Wednesdays of each month.

Just a few words about what KNIT Café is: fun, fellowship, a time to connect the physical to the spiritual. Spiritual knitting has been around for a long time here is an excerpt from "Sightings-Knitting Ministries" that explains.

Susan Jorgensen, one of the authors of *Knitting Into the Mystery*, has remarked that "knitting connects us to the divine deeply and simply." It also connects us to each other and to our pasts. Recently, showing my mother a hat I knitted for my daughter, she remembered a story about my great-great-grandmother, a professional milliner. My female ancestors didn't share my religion, my nationality, or, say, my ability to vote, but they're connected to me through a four-ply strand of wool. Like me, and I hope my daughter one day, these women kept their family's heads, toes, and hearts warm through the work of their hands. In fact, "knitting ministries" can be found throughout the country (some of them web-based endeavors). These groups range from a few people meeting over coffee to national organizations with multiple chapters. Typically made up mostly of women, these ministries knit for those in need, be they local homeless animals, children living in poverty, or specific groups identified by the knitters. Sometimes the groups pray and knit. Sometimes knitting *is* the prayer, and the knitted object an offering.

If you are interested in visiting our group, we would love you to join us. Dee Powell is group leader.
