2 Corinthians 9:7

⁷ Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver

It is time for the **Easter Offering (March 29th and April 5th)** and HALF of the Offering stays here in our local area. I know, there are so many organizations trying to help people in need all over the world for different reasons; food, water, medical assistance, financial assistance, mission outreach. The list is never ending. There are so many just in our area alone that sometimes we become overwhelmed just thinking about which group we should give our money to or which group we should volunteer with. We ask ourselves who needs assistance the most? What can we do to make a difference in someone's life? Who should we help?

First, Pray and let God be your guide...you will always give the right amount at the right time to the right organization. Having said that; let me tell you about a new and still growing place that helps everyone and anyone who is in need, and all from one location.

Hope Connection: Levy St. Project led by Hope for the Homeless

The Vision of HOPE for the Homeless is that no individual or family has to experience homelessness in NWLA. They are a non-profit 501c3 that serves as the HUD mandated homeless Continuum of Care for NWLA. They serve the role of front door for those who are homeless to enter the system of care.

The Levy St Project located at 2350 Levy Street, Shreveport, is a truly collaborative project that is streamlining, connecting, and making the maximum economic use of the existing homeless services resources in the S/B area. They renovated three warehouses to meet specification needs and there are over a dozen organizations consolidating their efforts in one location (Hope Connections) to better serve the homeless and our community. Just to mention a few, there are offices for HOPE for the Homeless, Homeless coalition for NWLA, the VOA, the VA, located onsite to manage the collaborative project. They are a "one –stop-shop" now that they have the Levy St Project. Well, almost…..a couple of things are still under construction and our assistance is needed. Their goal is to approach and assist the "chronically homeless" so they no longer fall through the cracks.

The project has 5 primary parts designed to triage and prioritize the immediate needs of clients:

Coordinated Access Point, The goal of all parts of the project will be to provide the services needed to quickly obtain and maintain the most appropriate type of services and permanent housing for every homeless person in our community.

Drop-In Center (Day Shelter), which provides shower facilities, laundry facilities, telephones, computers, and mail receipt service. It also serves as a refuge and resting place for those who have nowhere to go. The Drop-In Center is run by certified Peer Support Specialists that steer clients towards services that will help them obtain and maintain permanent housing. This **program is privately funded by churches of various denominations in the community** who sponsor an area of the Center and generously provide supplies, and bring "Brown Bag Dinners" for clients every week-day. They depend heavily on donations from the community to support the needs of its clients. Volunteers are welcome and needed for many things in the Day Shelter.

Street Outreach Team provides services in the field to those homeless persons who are living on the streets, abandoned buildings, or emergency shelters. The Outreach Team consists of a substance abuse professional, a mental health professional, formerly homeless individuals, and volunteers from local agencies who serve the homeless. They try to build relationships the homeless by offering them food, blankets, or other essentials. After they gain the trust of the client, they then try to engage those with mental illness into case management services to link the client to healthcare, substance abuse treatment, mental health treatment, and/or transportation with the ultimate goal of the client obtaining and remaining in housing.

Low Restriction Shelter has a campaign currently under way to raise funding for the new addition. This is where our Outreach Committee would like to use the Easter Offering this year. It will have 25 veteran beds downstairs and 35 civilian beds upstairs. They do not have as many restrictions as the Salvation Army and Rescue Mission do. They are also working on separate areas for the women as well as other very needed services. The YWCA will be restarting soon and will be located there also. Volunteers will be welcome in these areas too.

Hospitality House Soup Kitchen will be operated by Christian Services. Their building is still under construction and will hopefully be open in a few months. Volunteers definitely welcome.
