From Interim Regional Minister

Dear Friends in the Great River Region,

We are up to 28 families who have been displaced. FCC Baton Rouge is in need of air mattresses, pillows, blankets, and linen. These items will help with immediate and for the next month. Once the families get back into their homes, they will not be able to use the beds. They can use these items now in the shelters and when they go back to their homes. You can mail these items directly to the FCC Baton Rouge: 8484 Old Hammond Highway, Baton Rouge, LA 70809. I am heading to Indianola on Thursday morning and on to Baton Rouge on Saturday. If you are in the immediate area and can drop some items by the Regional Office by Thursday morning, I can take them in my car. Please call me at 501-944-4305 or the GRR Regional Office at 501-562-5063. You can also message me on FB.

Also, Week of Compassion has given us \$9,000 so far, for the displaced families. These grants are for immediate needs (food, clothing, shelter) and for FCC Baton Rouge as they are providing for these families. Once the families, are back in their homes, further assessments and grants will be made available.

So your giving is working for the good of those who need it right now. Thank you!!!"

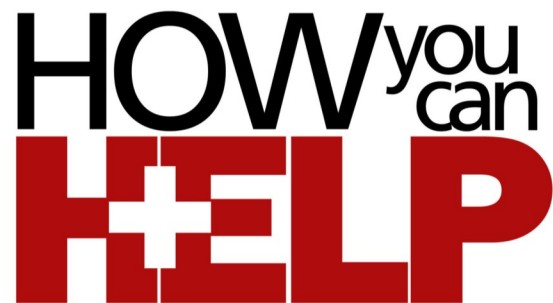

Following are items that are being requested in the flooded area around Baton Rouge. Please donate what you can, to help the flood victims . Donations can be dropped off in the church office.

PERSONAL ITEMS: Toothbrushes, toothpaste, razors, , shave cream, bleach, deodorant, wipes, combs, household sponges, brushes, disinfectant, cleaning supplies, shampoo, hand sanitizer, soap, bug spray, body wash.

WORK ITEMS: first aid items, , heavy duty garbage bags, feminine products, spray bottles, socks, work gloves, rubber gloves

CLOTHING ITEMS: T-shirts, shorts, underwear, towels, wash cloths, baby wipes, diapers, baby soaps, baby shampoo
