

KHCC to enter time of self-study to affirm and revision our mission.

As the interim moves forward, we are making plans to involve the whole congregation in the celebration and evaluation of our existing ministries and creatively plan for the next chapter in the life of the church.

With the approval of the General Board on May 20th, KHCC will now move forward in this process by working with Hope Partnership for Missional Transformation - a ministry of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) to help us reexamine our present and plan for our future by enrolling in the Epiphany service.



The Epiphany service is designed to help a congregation imagine, and then live into, a new vision for mission.

During the one+ year process, our congregation and its leaders will be encouraged to look closely at the "why" of what we do. When we are clear on why we exist, we can discover innovative ways to do ministry and transform our community both inside and outside our walls.

This task involves 5 separate steps:

Immediately - We will gather profile information about our congregation for Hope Partnership to use to create a personalized assessment of our congregation and surrounding neighborhoods

Summer - Hope Partnership will make an on-site visit to get a first-hand understanding of your congregation's setting and meet with leaders and church members.

Fall - Our Hope Partnership Facilitator will lead two on-site weekend retreats with our

leaders and members. The first retreat will help re-orient our leadership style from "managing a church" toward "transforming the community" as guided by the Spirit.

Two months after the first retreat, the congregation's leaders reconvene with the Hope Partnership Facilitator to develop our mission plan.

Late fall – This plan will be presented to the congregation and, working together, we will pursue a distinct future path and transform our ministry.

Ongoing – our key leaders will have e-sessions with Hope Partnership to coach us along the transformation journey.

ByGeorge We just celebrated our 96th anniversary as a congregation. We know our founders shared a vision of what this new church start could become at the corner of Kings Highway and Line, and they gifted us with traditions to celebrate and facilities to use as a tool for ministry. Over the next months we have an opportunity to renew our vision of relevance to our community. If we are diligent, in a year or so we will have not only new pastoral leadership, but (more importantly) a new sense of direction and a renewed passion for our faith.

Pentecost Offering received June 2nd and 9th

This year's Pentecost offering will be divided between The Arc Caddo-Bossier and the Disciple's General Ministries – part of that offering will stay in the Great River Region to start and uphold new churches, and the rest is used across the United States and Canada by New Church Ministry to support the recruiting, assessing, training and coaching of new church leaders. Our Disciple church planters remain committed to answering God's call . . . to serve their neighbors, spread the gospel, and make more Disciples.
