Online Giving Option

As we announced last week, KHCC is now accepting donations by electronic means. Some have already signed up and several others have indicated they will. Remember, we still accept cash and checks! If you enjoy putting your gift in the offering in that way, that option will continue.

If you are interested in giving electronically, go to our website [Kings Highway Christian Church](#) and click on “online giving” in the upper right hand corner. Another page will pop up and will take you through the steps to set this up. You will need to provide bank routing and account number and a password – the password must be at least 8 characters and contain 3 of these elements: upper case letter, lower case letter, a number, a symbol. (That sounds complicated, but you should only have to do it once.)

Fifty two members of KHCC were in attendance Wednesday evening for the first step in our Epiphany long range planning process. Nadine Burton, our Regional Minister, moderated a question and answer session and Dave Moore (our assessor and consultant) explained cycles of congregational vitality and asked each person present to indicate where they thought our church was on that particular scale.

Earlier in the day, Dave met with staff, had an extensive walk through of the building, met with our Treasurer, and had a one hour driving tour of the area. 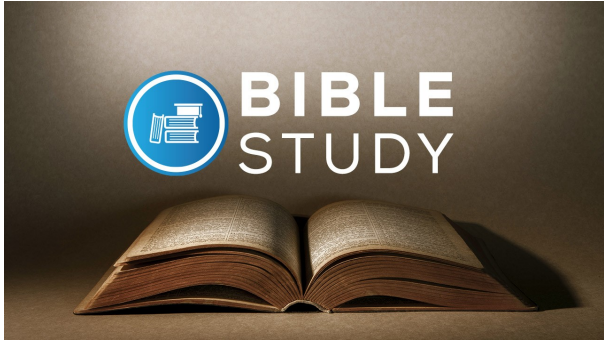
