

Over the last month my son Will has learned a painful lesson. A few weeks ago we were riding bikes in our neighborhood when Will rode over a small pile of leaves. It was the kind of thing you could do a hundred times with no problem but these leaves were wet and slippery and Will's bike ended up slipping from under him and he ended up on the ground. A few days later he was playing basketball in the driveway when he slipped on some wet leaves and once again crashed to the ground. He popped up from both of these falls right away without a scratch, but the lesson was starting to sink in: leaves can be slippery.

One thing I noticed about both of these falls was how quickly they happened. What a surprise it always is to find yourself on the ground when a moment before you had been going along your merry way. Most of our worst falls happen when we least expect them. This all reminds me of 1 Corinthians, verse 12, "So if you think you are standing firm, be careful that you don't fall!" It is often when we are at our most confident and assured that we make a misstep and our worst falls come. During this new year we would all be well advised to seek God's help in watching our step in all that we do, particularly those areas where our falls can also drag down those that we love.

Special Guest Speaker Scott Crichton



Scott Crichton is serving his 21st year as judge with the First Judicial District Court. Having served on both the civil and criminal divisions, Judge Crichton has presided over hundreds of jury trials and well over a thousand hearings and bench trials.

Scott is President of the Louisiana District Judges Association for the 2011-12 term. He also serves on the Advisory Committee to the Supreme Court on Judicial Canons, the Louisiana Supreme Court Committee on Judicial Ethics, the Court Rules Committee (Rules for Louisiana District Courts and Juvenile Courts, appendices and Numbering Systems for Louisiana Family and Domestic Relations Procedures), the Criminal Best Practices Committee and is 2011-12 Chairman of the CLE Committee of the Shreveport Bar Association. He was previ-

ously a member of the Continuing Legal Education and the Diversity committees of the Louisiana State Bar Association. Scott is certified by the National Judicial College in program design and has recently graduated from the 2011 inaugural class of the Louisiana Judicial Leadership Institute. Judge Crichton teaches a PowerPoint teen consequences program, Don't Let This Be You, which he created 6 years ago and has since presented to more than 15,000 teenagers/parents at various Shreveport high schools, churches and community groups, and has recently designed another PowerPoint program, Sexting, Texting and Beyond, for teenagers, parents and teachers on electronic laws and related misbehavior.

He received a Bachelor of Science degree in 1976 from Louisiana State University and a Juris Doctor degree in 1980 from Paul M. Hebert LSU Law Center. Prior to his election to the bench in 1990, he served as an assistant district attorney for Caddo Parish for a decade and maintained a civil practice. He has served as an adjunct instructor of Business Law at LSU-Shreveport.

Scott and his wife, Susie, have two sons, both of whom are in law school.

A "Note" from the KHCC Music Department - Louise Chamberlain: This is a story behind some of the hymns we sing in church.

PRAISE GOD, FROM WHOM ALL BLESSINGS FLOW



Before Charles Wesley or Isaac Watts, there was Thomas Ken who has been called "England's first hymnist." He was born in 1637 in Little Berkhampstead on the fringes of greater London. When his parents died, he was raised by his half- sister and her husband who enrolled him in Winchester College, an historic boys' school. Thomas was later ordained to the ministry and returned to Winchester as a chaplain.

To encourage the devotional habits of the boys, Thomas wrote three hymns in 1674. This was revolutionary because English hymns had not yet appeared. Only the Psalms were sung in public worship. Ken suggested the boys use the hymns privately in their room.

One hymn was to be sung upon waking, another at bedtime, and a third at midnight, if sleep didn't come. His morning hymn had THIRTEEN stanzas, beginning with:

Awake, my soul, and with the sun thy daily stage of duty run; Shake off dull sloth and joyful rise, to pay thy morning sacrifice.

The evening hymn, equally meaningful, included this verse:

All praise to Thee, my God, this night, for all the blessings of the light! Keep me, O keep me, King of kings, beneath Thine own almighty wings.

All three hymns ended with a common stanza, which has since become the most widely sung verse in the world.

Praise God, from Whom all blessings flow;/Praise Him, all creatures here below;/Praise Him above, ye heavenly host;/Praise Father, Son, and Holy Ghost.

During the reign of King James II, Thomas, by now a bishop, was sent to the Tower of London for his Protestant convictions. After his release, Thomas retired to the home of a wealthy friend where he died on March 11, 1711. He was buried at sunrise, and the "Doxlogy" was sung at his funeral.

On a personal note, this is one hymn or response that we sing every Sunday. Perhaps now that we know the meaning behind the "Doxology" it will have more meaning for us. At least we don't have to sing Thirteen stanzas!!!
