

From the Minister..

On Sunday evening we had a productive and interesting meeting where we heard about and discussed the proposed improvements to the sanctuary. There were over 50 church members in attendance and the meeting lasted just over an hour-and-a-half. The proposal we heard included...

Mounting our current projector on the balcony ledge with a new lens

Installing a video switcher to work with the projector

Running audio cables under the floor and installing audio jacks

Adding a new circuit and additional electrical outlets

Purchasing a keyboard and electronic drum kit

Installing a retractable screen behind the arch over the baptistery

Building a portable audio cabinet that could be moved into the sanctuary for the 11:11 service

Removing the back pew in the transept area near the steps that lead up to the church offices

Accomplishing all of this would, among other things, create in the sanctuary a second sound system that could be used by those leading the 11:11 service. It would cost the church an estimated \$27,373.

During our discussion there were several people who voiced their support for the idea of moving the 11:11 service to the sanctuary. However, most of our time was spent asking and answering questions about the proposal. There were also many excellent suggestions that were made concerning the proposed changes.

There were two suggestions that seemed of particular importance to me. The first was the suggestion that instead of creating two sound systems, one for each service, we look into <u>improving the existing sound system so that it</u> <u>could work for both services</u>. While this would be more expensive, it would allow us to correct several problems that we are having with our current sound system. One of these perceived problems is the current location of the soundboard at the top corner of the balcony. It was suggested that we look into moving the soundboard to the bottom of the balcony or behind the back pew on the ground level.

The second suggestion that seemed particularly important to me had to do with concerns regarding the proposed retractable screen that would be installed behind the arch above the baptistery. It was suggested that we <u>seek further information from the contractor</u> as to how the screen would be attached, where it would and wouldn't be visible in the sanctuary, and whether the installation would involve cutting into the painted ceiling above the baptistery.

This is of course only a small sample of what we talked about, but just these two items were enough to send us back to the drawing board regarding the plans for improvements. In the coming weeks a new proposal will be developed that takes into account what was said at the Sunday evening meeting.

Remember, the conversation is not over. There will be more opportunities to discuss the proposed move and the proposed improvements to the sanctuary. No decisions will be made on this issue until details are provided, questions are answered and voices are heard. Currently, our next scheduled opportunity to hear an update on progress and discuss this issue will be our board meeting on May 7th. However, I am looking forward to writing more about this in the coming weeks here in the church newsletter.

A "Note" from the KHCC Music Department

"Come thou Fount of every Blessing"

Robert Robinson had a rough beginning. His father died when he was young, and his mother, unable to control him, sent him to London to learn barbering. What he learned instead was drinking and gang-life. When he was seventeen, he and his friends reportedly visited a fortune-teller. Relaxed by alcohol, they laughed as she tried to tell their futures. But something about the encounter bothered Robert, and that evening he suggested to his buddies they attend the evangelistic meeting being held by George Whitefield.

Whitefield was one of history's greatest preachers, with a voice that was part foghorn and part violin. That night he preached from Matthew 3:7: "But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, 'Brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come?' "Bursting into tears, Whitefield exclaimed, "Oh my hearers! The wrath to come! The wrath to come!"

Robert immediately sobered up and sensed Whitefield was preaching directly to him. The preacher's words haunted him for nearly three years, until December 10, 1755, when he gave his heart to Christ.

Robert soon entered the ministry, and three years later at age twenty-three, while serving Calvinist Methodist Chapel in Norfolk, England, he wrote a hymn for his sermon on Pentecost Sunday. It was a prayer that the Holy Spirit would flood into our hearts with his streams of mercy, enabling us to sing God's praises and remain faithful to Him. "Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing" has been a favorite of the church since that day.

Robinson continued working for the Lord until 1790, when he was invited to Birmingham, England, to preach for Dr. Joseph Priestly, a noted Unitarian. There, on the morning of June 8th, he was found dead at age fifty-four, having passed away quietly during the night.

Take a few moments to offer this hymn as a personal prayer, especially remembering those last insightful lines:

Let thy goodness, like a fetter, /bind my wandering heart to thee. /Prone to wander, Lord, I feel it, /prone to leave the God I love. /Here's my heart, O take and seal it, /seal it for Thy courts above.
