

Joseph G. Jarzabek Senior Litigation Counsel

Born in Hartford, Connecticut (1950) and traveled extensively as his father was career Air Force.

Graduated Captain Shreve H.S. in 1968

Enlisted USN July 1968. Trained initially as an Electronics Technician. Later trained and served as a Nuclear Reactor Operator and Reactor Technician. Honorable Discharge January 1975.

June 1975 to July 1977 - attended Sam Houston State University and graduated with a BS degree with a major in Law Enforcement.

August 1977 to June 1980 - attended Louisiana State University Law School and graduated with a JD degree.

Admitted to practice in October of 1980.

August 1980 to August 1983 - clerked for Judge Tom Stagg.

August 1983 - began duties as an Assistant United States Attorney for the Western District of Louisiana. Assigned cases in all areas, but with emphasis on white collar crime and public corruption.

March 1989 - appointed to Deputy Chief of Criminal Division position.

September 1994 - September 2010 - appointed to Criminal Division Chief position.

September 2010 - Appointed to Senior Litigation Counsel position.

A "Note" from the KHCC Music Department

"THIS IS MY FATHER'S WORLD"

Maltbie Babcock was arguably the most remarkable student Syracuse University had ever seen. Hailing from an aristocratic family, he was a brilliant scholar with a winning personality. Tall and steel-muscled, he was an outstanding athlete, expert swimmer, and captain of the baseball team. He also directed the university's orchestra, played several instruments, and composed original compositions. A proficient vocalist, he directed the university glee club. He entertained other students by drawing and doing impersonations. On the side, he was an avid fisherman. (When did he have time??)

He would have been successful in any profession, but God called him to the ministry; and after further training at Auburn Theological Seminary, he became pastor of the First Presbyterian Church in Lockport, New York. It was a beautiful area—midway between Lake Erie and Lake Ontario, not far from Niagara Falls—and Maltbie enjoyed hiking and running in the hills outside town. Telling his secretary, "I'm going out to see my Father's world," he would run or hike a couple of miles into the countryside where he'd lose himself in nature.

It was during his pastorate at Lockport that he wrote a sixteen stanza poem, each verse beginning with the words "This is my Father's world."

In 1886, Maltbie was called to the Brown Memorial Church in Baltimore. While there, he traveled widely and was in great demand on college campuses. He was a fresh, engaging speaker who never failed to stimulate students. In 1899, he moved to the Brick Presbyterian Church in New York City. Here he found it more difficult to take off on his hikes. The work load was enormous, but Maltbie faced it stoically, writing:

Be strong! We are not here to play, to dream, to drift, We have hard work to do and loads to lift; Shun not the struggle. Face it. 'Tis God's gift. Be strong!

When he was forty-two, his church presented him with a special gift—a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. With great excitement, Maltbie departed by ship. While enroute at Naples, Italy, he was seized with a deadly bacterial fever and died at the International Hospital on May 18, 1901.

After his death, his wife compiled his writings into a book entitled "Thoughts for Everyday Living", published in 1901. Included was Maltbie's "This Is My Father's World."

Personal note: Reading about Maltbie Babcock, made me think of our Craig Pratt. He plays French Horn, composes music, directs the choir, plays in the Shreveport, Longview, and Texarkana Symphonies as well as holding down another job at Gulf South Pipeline! I really don't think he could work in baseball, however knowing him, he would give it a shot!
