

Christian Education

The first task for each Stewardship committee member was to pick a church Ministry and explain what they do. Here are some of the responsibilities of Christian Education:

- 1) Budget
- 2) The River Runs
- 3) Easter Egg Hunt
- 4) Senior Banquet
- 5) Children's Activities
- 6) Promotion and Celebration Sunday
- 7) Acolytes
- 8) Miscellaneous

I would like to further explain responsibility and makeup.

It is the Committees task to establish the budget for adult classes, youth and children's activities.

The River Runs consist of Preschool-5th Grade and the responsibilities are to recruit leaders and provide training for traditional and contemporary services children's church, keep the play room organized, create and distribute schedule to leaders, purchase snacks and keep cups and napkins in the supply closet.

For the Easter Egg Hunt they ask for donations, purchase eggs and prizes and coordinate with Chi Rho and CYF for stuffing and hiding the eggs.

The Senior Banquet consists of assisting Becky Flippo and the deacons with cooking, decorating, gifts and serving. In the last couple of years the food has been cooked by the Christian Education Committee, but the Diaconate cooked and served in past years.

The Children's Activities responsibilities are to recruit leaders and schedule leaders for each week, coordinate calendar with you activities and purchase supplies as needed.

Promotion and Celebration Sunday responsibilities are:

- 1) We have Promotion Sunday in August to coincide with school starting.
- 2) Celebration Sunday is held in September right after Labor Day
- 3) Coordinate giving Bibles to new 3rd graders (Service Class provides funds for this.)
- 4) Purchase Bibles and have names engraved.
- 5) Teacher of the Year-Assist David as needed for 2012.
- 6) Teacher Recognition

Organize the Acolytes (open to JYF and Chi Rho youth) and provide training, keep candle lighters in working order, provide schedule for Acolytes.

The Miscellaneous Responsibilities include:

- 1) Mothers Day Ellie Boyd provides flowers—charged to Christian Education and make sure children hand them out
- 2) Fathers Day usually book marks are made to distribute to fathers
- 3) Maintain all teachers' closet
- 4) Maintain the Library
- 5) Maintain Bulletin Boards
- 6) Assist Becky Flippo as needed for Camp registrations

After a discussion with Mrs. Georgia Monk I realized that there were many more elements to Christian Education that I may not have touched on that they work closely with: All Sunday Schools, some of the Afternoon Activities, Support Groups, Bible Studies, Pastor Class-Baptism Class, Skate Night and in general anything to further Christian Education.

A "Note" from the KHCC Music Department

HIS NAME IS WONDERFUL



This song was born in a small church. In an era when bigger is better and success is usually measured by statistics, it's important to remember that small churches can still do great things.

Audrey Mae Mieir was born on May 12, 1916, and attended L.I.F.E. Bible College. After marrying Charles B. Mieir in 1936, she was ordained in the Gospel ministry in the International Church of the Foursquare Gospel.

Audrey was a gifted pianist and an inspiring worship leader, song director, and choral clinician. In the 1950's, she was working in her brother-in-law's church, Bethel Union Church in Duarte, California, a suburb of Los Angeles. Christmas fell on Sunday that year, and the church was decorated with pine boughs. The choir loft was now a manger scene, and the young people had worked hard on the performance.

"As the morning service began," Audrey later said, "I was almost overwhelmed with the fragrance, the sounds, and most of all, with the gentle moving of the Spirit in that church. The pastor stood to his feet, opened the Bible, and said, 'His name shall be called Wonderful.' I tell you the truth, that's all it took. I wrote the words and music in the flyleaf of my Bible. In the Sunday evening service, I taught the chorus to a group of young people, and it was sung for the first time."

But Audrey had only written the first part of the song, and though it was well received, it needed more. A friend told her "Audrey, it's a good song but there just isn't enough of it. Maybe you could write a bridge for it." Audrey went to lunch that day with her friend's advice ringing in her ears. She ordered a hamburger, opened her Bible, and found a list of names given to Jesus in the Scripture. She jotted some of them down on her napkin. After returning to her office, Audrey went to the piano and began writing: "He's the great Shepherd, the Rock of all ages, Almighty God is He...."

Though it was inspired on Christmas day by a traditional Christmas text, "His Name is Wonderful" has never been pegged as a Christmas hymn. It's been a favorite of Christians throughout the year.

My best friend in school and church, Judy Doty, and I sang this as a duet several times. Next time she comes to visit me, hopefully we can sing it again here at KHCC.

My sister, Jan, and the entire Jon Holley family also thank you for your prayers, during his illness and since his passing. We feel blessed to be a part of such a loving and caring church family.



BloodDrive




