Many of the Church Members pay their tithes in monthly, quarterly or yearly increments, so the children assumed that their parents paid very little or none at all strictly based on observation. We certainly do not want to deceive our children into thinking that spreading God's word is not costly. One particular congregation decided to put a little money in the plates each week so that the children could actually see contributions being made. This particular Church made a point and got some extra resources to do God's Work.

I know that I did not get the story exactly correct, but I think that I came close.

The Pentecost offering is always divided in half. One half goes to the Disciples New Church Movement and the other half stays in our local area.

Our Theme this year connects the disciples New Church movement with the established Churches. In 2001 a vision became a goal as a movement and dream was launched. The vision was to establish 1000 new Churches world-wide by the year 2020. To date 830 new Churches have been founded which includes 19 languages. (for more info see: www.hopepmt.org)

Now stop and think for a moment, 91 short years ago we were just beginning. Think of the help we must have received in order to establish a Church so people could gather to listen and share God's Word and Fellowship. People gave of their time, food, prayers and finances. Where would we be without the help and guidance that we received? As David said we are Blessed to have a past and a future. In the past (our beginning) we needed assistance, now it is our turn (for the future) to help carry on God's plan and help make many more houses of God.

The second half of our offering stays in our local area to help an Organization of our choosing. This year our half will be going to

the Gingerbread House Bossier/Caddo Children's Advocacy Center. They are a community-based non-profit organization that serves abused children. They work closely with law enforcement and child services and district attorney's offices. All of their services are provided at no cost to the victim's family. Their mission is to lessen the trauma experienced by child abuse victims as allegations are investigated and to provide support for the child victim in any resulting proceeding within the criminal justice system.
