# Ash Wednesday — From the Minister

If you are out running an errand on Wednesday, February 18<sup>th</sup> you may notice a few people with grey marks on their foreheads or their hands. It may take you a moment to remember that it's Ash Wednesday and to realize that these people must have attended an early morning Ash Wednesday service where they were marked by their priest or minister with these ashes. This is an old tradition in the Catholic Church and some Protestant denominations. The ashes used to make those marks are made from the burned palm branches that were used by the church on Palm Sunday the previous year. The ashes are a symbol of our sinfulness and our mortality, a reminder of our dependence on God's grace.

I do admire those people who not only attend an Ash Wednesday service but also keep the ashes on their foreheads so that others can see that they were in church. When I see them I am reminded of the verse in the Gospel of Mark, chapter 8 where Jesus instructs his

disciples to take up their crosses and follow him. Jesus goes on to say, "If anyone is ashamed of me in this sinful generation, I will be ashamed of them when I return in glory."

I am looking forward to attending and participating in the Ash Wednesday service at Broadmoor Christian Church on Youree Drive. The services will begin at 7:00 in the evening on Ash Wednesday, February 18<sup>th</sup>. I hope you will plan to be there. It will be a meaningful way to begin your journey to Easter.



Through Week of Compassion, Disciples from across N. America responded---quickly to disasters. In 2013 and 2014 WOC sent grants from its Compassion in Action fund immediately to help affected families of the First Christian Church in Tupelo, MS and First Christian Church in Washington, NC. WOC also helped direct designated gifts to both Washington and Tupelo, providing resources for their interim needs and rebuilding. Let's not forget the flooding in Colorado. WOC and Disciples Volunteering began reaching out to First Christian Church, Loveland, Colorado, about how to best partner and respond in affected communities. Empowering communities impacted by disasters and empowering congregations to minister and respond: that is the work of Week of Compassion.

**A Better Future for Indonesia:** Your donations to WOC are supporting a CWS refugee center in Jakarta, where children begin learning both Indonesian and English.

**Historical Change:** Water in Kenya —Together, WOC's partner CWS and the people of Mangulo built a sand dam and shallow well. The women don't have to walk over 6 miles and wait in line to draw water for 4 to 5 hours. Now, they are drinking safe, clean water from the well. There is now water for vegetables and fruit trees.

What gift, skill or quality do you possess that you can use to make the world and your community a better place? As you can see from above every gift, every dollar, every prayer is brought together and then stretched far and wide across America and other countries where they then become miracles and indescribable gifts.
