From the Senior Minister

Recently I was looking through the minutes of some old board meetings here at Kings Highway Christian Church and I ran across some entries that caught my attention. At a board meeting in 1944 it was reported that the church's members and clergy had been forced to cut back on their evangelism and pastoral care calls because of the gasoline and tire rationing of World War II. It must have been difficult for the church to have to cut back on these important ministries, but I understand that most Americans at the time were happy to make these kinds of sacrifices at home if it would be of any help to those who were fighting.

There was another entry that caught my attention from a board meeting held in July 1947. It read, "Mr. Robertson reported that David Spencer contributes 900 pounds of ice each Sunday used in cooling the sanctuary." During those summer board meetings in the 40s and 50s the conversation often turned to ideas on how to cool the sanctuary. As early as 1945 there were discussion in the board meetings regarding the possibility of installing an air conditioning unit in the church—this was cutting edge technology at the time (it would take another 9 years for the first air conditioning unit to be installed here at KHCC). When you think of how much work it would be to haul 900 pounds of ice into the church

each Sunday you can imagine why the church was interested in air conditioning. One of my responsibilities when I arrive early on Sunday morning is turning on the air conditioning in the sanctuary; it takes me less than a minute to complete this chore, nothing like the time it would take to haul in 900 pounds of ice.

Reading through these board reports has reminded me that every generation here at the church has had its own set of challenges. For some it was the rationing of wartime, for others it was the fact that people were deciding which church in town to join based on whether or not the church was airconditioned. With every challenge the church adapted, as challenges led to amazing transformations. This is the kind of growth and change that God, present in our lives and in our church, makes possible. May God continue to guide this congregation in the years to come and may we always be able to hear His voice in our lives and in here in our church.

Board Chairman Synopsis

Monday, July 18, 2016

We try to bring all Church Members up to date as to the activities of your Church Board over the past two months.

A motion was made and seconded to adopt the Agenda as printed, after an addition under Items for Action, The Property Committee's request for approval for \$1,650.00 for tree and stump removal and fill dirt for the former McGuire property. The motion passed unanimously.

Treasurer, Mike Corkran, stated that we were short for the month of June compared to last year, largely because we received some large gifts that we will not receive again. Mike stated that we are about \$1,500 below budgeted amounts and pledges for the Capital Fund are right on target. We have some Capital Expenses that were higher than anticipated, which accounts for much of the negative variance for the month. Mike stated that this is what happens when we have air-conditioning, roofing and furnace expenses that have been put off until they can't be put off any longer. The good news is that they are getting fixed. He stated that our Capital Loan Balance is down \$97,000 from last year at this time.

No New & Seasonal Programs and Ministries were reported.

Christian Education Chair, Linda Dame, reported that Bible School has just finished, under the direction of Chair Elect, Trish Krippner. The Theme was High Seas Adventure and Becky and Joey Flippo did a fantastic job on the props used by the children. They made hats out of newspapers and the children all seemed to really enjoy themselves. There were about 38 children in attendance each night. Thanks to all of the adult Sunday School Classes for providing the snack suppers and Deanna Beaubouf for leading the adult Bible Schools with different speakers each night. We also want to thank the anonymous donors for purchasing the Vacation Bible School Tee Shirts. All camp and conference dates have been set for 2017 and the first will be in February, with Snoasis. Fall Fandango will be October 7-9, 2016. Linda reported that 6 computers have recently been purchased for the Chi Rho Sunday School Class and they are in the process of putting locks on the classroom doors. A Computer Program, "Bible Champions" has been purchased and consists of 14 Bible Studies. The Chi Rho students will learn the studies, games, etc. then loan them to the River. There will be 6 Chi Rho students who attend regularly in the Fall. Linda invited anyone who might be interested in helping with any of the Children's Sunday School Classes or Children, Worship and Wonder, to let her know. Linda stated that they can always use additional people to work with the children.

Evangelism Chair, Robert Asher, Continues to hold movie night, with the next scheduled for September 17, 2016. Skate Night for July was cancelled, because of low attendance, but the Pioneer Class will be hosting the next Skate Night on August 26, 2016.

Membership Committee Chair, Carol Renee Eakin, reported a successful covered dish dinner on July 3rd, with about 130 attendees on the holiday weekend. Carol Renee thanked Doll Burk and Jessie Matthews for the patriotic decorations. The next event will be on September 11th, Celebration Sunday. Chi-Rho will hold their annual Potato Dinner, which is their Primary Fundraiser for their trips and Mission projects for the year.

Associate Minister, Ellie Bulnes, began the Hispanic Outreach report stating that there have been no ESL Classes this summer, but classes will resume on August 29th and will meet on Mondays and Wednesdays for 6-8 pm. Casa Esperanza is running well and is booked until December. They installed a new thermostat that allows better control of the temperature in the house and this is already making a difference in the utility bills. Up to three families can stay in the house at a time. Ellie will begin putting pictures of grateful children in the Newsletter.

Outreach Chair, Allen Swilley, reported a total of \$14,010.45 in disbursements for the first 6 months of this year, which consists of both budgeted and collected Special Offerings. The recipients were Church Finance Council, Great River Region, Disciples Mission Fund, New Church Development (All Disciples of Christ), Noel Neighborhood Food Pantry, MLK Clinic, Common Ground Ministries, Support Our Troops, Highland Blessing Dinner, Christian Services and Honor Roll Dinner for students at Creswell Elementary and Highland Neighborhood picnic (both part of Community Renewal). In the last half of the year, Outreach opportunities will include DOC Higher Education, Shreveport-Bossier Rescue Mission, Regional Ministries and the Great River Region. Except for the Great River Region, which is a budgeted amount, the others receive our gifts from special offerings collected at Thanksgiving and Christmas.

Property Committee Chair, Dennis Murray, reported that as near as he can tell, about all of our air conditioning units were purchased 21 years ago in 1995. Because of their age, they are beginning to need replacing. Two units have been replaced in the Family Life Center and we are looking at replacing one in the Fellowship Hall. Dennis said we are just getting started, so replacement needs can be anticipated for some time to come. When we get into replacing furnaces in a building this old, we get into code issues, which can make it quite costly. Dennis will explain more when we get to Items for Action.

Linda Dame stated that she had received an email message from Bonnie Martin stating that they need more people to work the soundboard in both the Traditional and Contemporary Worship Services. Anyone who is interested needs to make it known, so they can begin training on the use of the soundboard. Bonnie also stated that in response to many questions, she and Greg are not moving and plan to continue their membership at Kings Highway Christian Church.

Stewardship Committee Chair, Martha Burgess, reported that her committee as adopted a program, New Consecration Sunday, for the upcoming Pledge Campaign. Consecration Sunday will be on Sunday October 23, 2016 and will be a combined service with a free lunch. This program uses a guest speaker for that Sunday, so they are working on securing a Speaker. The Campaign will not cover the Capital Fund another campaign will be started in the spring for the Capital Fund.

Board Chairman Synopsis Continued:

Diaconate Committee Chair, Deanna Beaubouf, reported that the Diaconate is doing well.

Elder Committee Chair, Chris Thompson – No Report

Long Range Committee Chair, Clint Snell reported that he received a request for 6 desktop computers several months ago. Clint has looked at the software and believes it is something the children will really enjoy, as it combines action games, Bible Characters and other activities they will enjoy. The 14 lessons should provide material for about 2 ½ years of lessons. It does not require Wi Fi. The computers, monitors, keyboards and mice were all purchased for \$2,177.98. Becky Flippo, Children's Director, purchase the software. They are working on getting locks for the doors and hope to have the computers and program up and running by Promotion Sunday.

Additional Items for Information:

Pete Bratlie reported that the Financial Oversight Committee learned that though CMF is no longer in existence, they still have a bank account. Financial Oversight recommends that the account be closed and the money remaining be used for Scholarships.

Bobby Shields stated that a copy of the financial policy has been made available to everyone. Bobby reminded everyone to watch every dollar that is spent and that money spent must go through the appropriate Committee. Known costs must be in the budget and planned for. Mike Corkran pointed out that even if budgeted, we may have to cut back if the money is not there. Even when an item is budgeted, it needs to be brought before the Board in the meeting prior to the money being spent. Process and procedures need to be followed.

Allen Swilley stated that he needs to add an item for action to this meeting agenda from the Outreach Committee. They request approval of \$2,200 to the Great River Region for the third quarter and \$500 to the Noel Food Pantry. Allen Swilley moved and Bobby Shields seconded the motion for approval for this item. Approval was unanimous.

Property is requesting approval of \$2,600 for the rewiring of the air conditioners in the Fellowship Hall, as there have been 2 units on one circuit. Dennis Murray made the motion, seconded by Allen Swilley. Motion Passed Unanimously.

Property is requesting ratification for the replacement of one of the air conditioning units in the Family Life Center Gym and for replacement of the AC/Heating unit on the east side of the Family Life Center. This was approved unanimously by the Executive Committee in June. Motion by Dennis Murray, seconded by Phillip Semon. Motion approved unanimously.
