It's been extremely helpful to review the weekly prayer concerns and hear reports of homebound/hospital visits from Sunday, and this meeting helps me plan pastoral contacts for the week.

Chris Thompson is currently Elder Chair, and with her leadership (as with everything she does) these meetings are both well organized and spiritually uplifting. Currently the Elders are meeting once a month on Monday evening (in lieu of the morning meeting) to allow those that can't make an early meeting a chance to attend. This evening meeting also allows time for study and discussion of topics germane to their duties as Elders.

Our Elders have undertaken their responsibilities as spiritual leaders of the congregation with enthusiasm. What is most visible (presiding at the door and the table on Sunday mornings) is only a small part of their work serving the congregation. There is a shift here that is significant: the ministers are assisting the Elders in providing pastoral care, rather than the reverse, as is true in most churches. This is a sign of a healthy congregation, as ministry is shared among a broad base of servant leaders, including many members beyond the Eldership. Discovering this sharing of ministry has been a pleasant surprise for me and it's definitely been worth getting up early.
