Have you noticed the “green banners” placed on the pulpit, lectern and communion table in our Sanctuary?

They look great, right? The green color adds some brightness to our beautiful sanctuary, however, they are not decorations. Actually, the green color represents a “season” of the *Liturgical Year of the Church*.

The Church Year has seasons and each season is represented by a color:

Advent – Violet

Christmas – White

Ordinary Time – Green

Lent – Violet

Easter – White

Pentecost – Red



Each season celebrates an important time of the church and redirects our focus to certain areas of Jesus’ ministry. The colors express emotions and ideas that are associated with each season.

Right now we are in the “Ordinary Time” that is celebrated in two parts: after Christmas and after Pentecost. The green color of the Ordinary Time is the color of growth - the spread of the Good News of Christ to all nations on Earth and focuses on the mission of the church in the world.

This is not something new for our church; we are just restarting this beautiful tradition. The next season we will celebrate is Advent. I will talk to you about this as the time draws closer.

Recently Vernon and I attended the 100-Year Anniversary Celebration of the First Christian Church (DOC) in Sulphur, Louisiana. They gave us a copy of the church's history and I was very interested in the following excerpt:

"Rev. John Newman began his ministry in 1924. He was also a missionary of the United Missionary Society and a Living Link Missionary of Kings Highway Christian Church of Shreveport. They sent him \$25 per month. The first of December each year he took a train to Shreveport and preached at the Kings Highway Church twice on Sunday and met with the Women's Missionary Society on Monday. Then he took a train back to Sulphur. He said, 'I always came back with some money because they gave me a love gift and it ranged from \$35 to \$95 each year.' Before Christmas each year he and his family received from this Shreveport congregation enough clothing to last until his next trip."

Time To Nominate!

Nominations begin October 6th. Each year, in the fall, the nominating committee meets to consider who to recommend to the congregation as officers for the next year. The recommendations include the board officers, trustees, elders, deacons and elders and deacons emeritus. The congregation is asked to recommend members for these positions. We need all recommendations in by October 21st. If you would like to serve in a particular position, you are certainly welcome to recommend yourself. Below we have listed the duties of elders and deacons. If you are contacted by the nominating committee to serve in one of these positions we ask that you please be prepared to give this request prayerful consideration. Nomination forms are located in the narthex and the church office.

Elder: According to our Church's By Laws.

"The Board of Elders shall have jurisdiction over the special welfare of the Church and its members: shall advise, counsel, comfort or admonish; shall serve the Lord's Table; shall be responsible for the public worship service of the Church, the supply of the pulpit, the form and manner of the administration of the sacraments of baptism and communion; and shall perform such other duties as may be assigned by the Official Board."

- Serve communion to the hospitalized and homebound.
- Serve as the spiritual leaders of the church.

- Meet each Monday morning to discuss and pray for the needs of the members of the congregation.
- Provide counsel to the ministers and board chair particularly in matters relating to worship, evangelism, and pastoral care.

Diaconate: According to our Church's By Laws.

"The Diaconate shall be charged with providing for the preparation of the church for all worship services and for the greeting and ushering of the worshipers; and the service of the Lord's Supper and receive offerings; shall minister to the sick and needy; shall counsel and do and perform all such other duties as may be assigned by the Official Board."

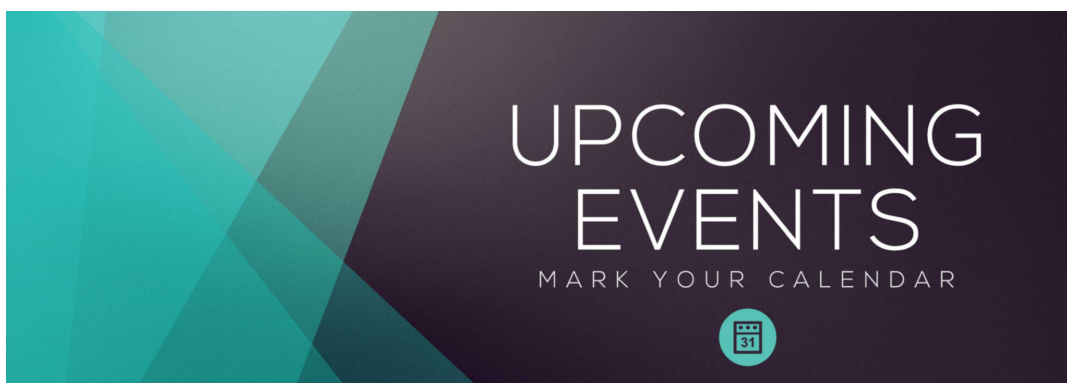
- Serve communion and collect offering, greet and usher in our worship services
- Serve as needed in carrying out worship, funerals, and weddings.
- Serve as representatives of the church to outside groups.

On September 16, 2019, the official Board of Kings Highway Christian Church voted to approve the Trustees to proceed with the sale of the adjacent real estate, known as Casa Esperanza and the McGuire property for the purpose of paying off the debt of the church and to have additional monies for the ministries of the church.
